 - The case study will be reviewed by the ICCA Registry management team who may suggest edits to some of the content to improve readability and may ask you questions to clarify any information that is not clear. Any suggested changes will be sent back to you as the data provider for your authorisation.
 - Expect up to 2 months between submitting a case study and it being published online
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Description

- Full name of ICCA
- Geographical area and geographic location
- Identity of the local community / indigenous peoples who live there.
- Population size of the community
- What is the main livelihood of the local community?
- What is special or unique about ICCA?

History and activities

- Date of establishment and brief history
- How did the establishment come about?
- What was the aim?
- What activities are currently underway? (development projects, conservation work)

Conservation

- What are you conserving? Are there specific (endangered) species protected?
- Does the site provide ecological services? E.g. water supply, weather control, flood defences, recreational or spiritual benefits)
- What impacts has conservation had? (number of species, biodiversity, quality of the ecosystem)
- How are the impacts of conservation measured or monitored?

Management and governance

- How does the community manage the area?
- Is there government support or laws to help management?
- What threats and problems does the area face? What attempts are made to overcome them?
- Have any prizes or distinctions been received?
- What impacts has the area had on the community? (For example, in health, education, housing, sanitation, operations, revenue)
- How is the community directly involved in the conserved area?

Next step and lessons learned

- What future activities do you plan or plan to happen?
- What are the next steps? What do you need; what do you not have?
- What lessons have been learned so far?
